

## **Lodging Options-Madison, Wisconsin**

We've listed hotels where we've had friends or relatives stay and that we feel are in safe neighborhoods and have interior hallways. There is a wide variety of accommodations in Madison, so if you want to find a particular chain, there is probably one of them in our area. The closest landmarks to Amy's house are the zoo (1 block) and Camp Randall stadium (5 blocks). It is considered to be "central Madison".

If you are going to look for other accommodations, anything on the EAST SIDE (by I-94) is 25 minutes away. Monona, West Side and Middleton are 20 minutes away. The three hotels listed meet our criteria of being safe, centrally located, within 15 minutes away, an easy drive, and the least expensive. (Note: prices vary depending on weekend.)

### **Road Star Inn 608-274-6900**

6900 Seybold Road, Madison

Rates, one night: \$73.00 double occupancy

Driving distance to training: Allow 15 minutes.

Advantages: next door to Arby's and Wendy's.

### **Country Inn and Suites 608-221-0055**

400 River Place, Monona

Rates, one night: \$96.00 double occupancy

Driving distance to training: Allow 15 minutes.

No restaurants next door, but there are restaurants on the way from this hotel to the training.

### **Super 8 Motel 608-258-8882, [www.super8madison.com](http://www.super8madison.com)**

1602 West Beltline Hiway, Madison

Rates, one night: \$80.00-100.00 double

Driving distance to Amy's: Ten minutes. (This is the closest hotel to Amy's house with the clearest directions.)

Advantages: next door to Perkin's and Rocky Rococo Pizza.

Another option is the **Madison Hostel**. 608-441-0144. Office hours are 8-11am and 5-9pm. Private rooms with 1-3 people are \$44.00-47.00. Shared rooms with 4-6 people are \$20.00-23.00. All rooms share bathroom facilities, television, and kitchen facilities in a dormitory style atmosphere. (Several participants have stayed here and enjoyed it.)

Note: It is less than a ten minute drive, but you will need clear directions to get from there to Amy's. I suggest you go to Google maps before leaving home.
